### Tonight's Predicted Cold Temperatures

Our temperatures tonight are predicted to be in the low to mid 30's with a wind chill in the 20s. Winds are expected to be 9 mph and higher all night so there is very little you can do for frost protection. However, keep in mind that **plants don't feel wind chill** - only we do (and our pets). With stone fruit in bloom, apples at tight cluster to pink, and pears at white bud, critical temperatures range from 25-28 degrees F. So we'll hope temperatures remain in the 30s even in low pockets.
