



Fireblight Update: May 13, 2022

As I mentioned in my email 4 days ago, we were going to reach the Fireblight infection potential today, and we have. Below is for Wallingford. Everyone has open flowers and enough heat units. Rain is predicted in some parts of the state tonight, and other areas had some last night or at least very heavy dew. An application of Strep within 48 hours of an infection (24 hours before or 24 hour after an infection) will take care of those blossoms open at the time. Add Regulaid at 1 pt./100 gals – do not concentrate it. DO NOT add Regulaid if you have to make another application later next week. Organic growers can use Double Nickel, Serenade or LifeGard.
